CITY COUNCIL APPROVES DEVELOPMENT

The Somerville City Council approved a development agreement with Hedgehog Group LLC., that will bring new commercial property to the City of Somerville. The new development will be on State Highway 36 near Thornberry Dr. The agreement provides for the moving of water and sewer utility lines with the city allocating funding to the project not to exceed \$22,500.
